The Language Science Fair, organized by the Language Science Station (LSS) in partnership with Planet Word, offers an interactive day of activities for all ages.

Visitors can dive into puzzles, crafts, and prizes at hands-on stations throughout the museum, and enjoy public talks by leading experts about the science behind how we communicate. Language scientists from the University of Maryland, Gallaudet University, Howard University, Georgetown University, and George Mason University will be on hand to share their work and answer questions.

The Language Science Fair is part of a nationwide series of STEM Day events celebrating the 75th Anniversary of the National Science Foundation (NSF). The Language Science Station and the University of Maryland's Language Science Center are proud to help mark NSF's contributions to the scientific study of language.
