Where Do Words Come From?

The 22-foot-tall wall of words speaks for itself — literally! Our talking word wall shares the history of the English language. Thanks to the LGBTQIA+ community, many popular words like "fierce" and "work" have taken on a new meaning. These unique and novel lexical entries enrich the English language and make our descriptions more colorful! Try to find "drama" or any newly coined words on the Word Wall.

The Spoken World

Dive headfirst into the awe-inspiring diversity of languages by meeting speakers of languages from around the world. While in this gallery, explore how different languages approach what linguist Kirby Conrod refers to as "social gender" and "noun class systems".

Check out Basque, Vietnamese, Icelandic, Japanese, Arabic, and Hebrew. Unearth which languages have no gender, dozens of gender

forms, or binary and heteronormative gender systems.

WORDS MATTER GALLERY:


Language and Identity
